

Rector's Message Walking in Love

"Walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, an offering and sacrifice to God." Ephesians 5:2



The scripture verse quoted above is a very familiar one to us as Episcopalians. We hear it every time we gather for the Eucharist as an invitation to bring our gifts of bread, wine, and money to

the Altar to be consecrated to the Lord as an act of thanksgiving.

It so happens that the theme prescribed by The Episcopal Network of Stewardship (TENS) for this year is "Walk in Love." One would think that whoever came up with the theme had spent time at Holy Trinity because Walking in Love is exactly what we believe to be the meaning of Stewardship. Perhaps more wonderful is that we do not simply believe it but we live it. We believe that our faithful stewardship of time, talent, and treasure is a fundamental expression of our love for God and one another.

We at Holy Trinity believe that Stewardship is love in action as clearly articulated by St. John: "We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers and sisters.

How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? 18 Little children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth. (1 John 3:16-18).

This belief and understanding shapes everything we do here at Holy Trinity and continues to be demonstrated in a variety of ways. I have seen it in the amount of time people like Judy & Gregg Monin have devoted to the School Golf Benefit so we can raise money to enable us to serve our students, I saw it in the amount of money given to rebuild our sanctuary entrance walk way to make it safer and welcoming, and I saw it in the responses of so many who gave generously toward the purchase of a car for one of our members whose car was irreparably damaged, and needed a car to get to his several jobs to support his family. Yes, I see it in the continued support for our outreach to the community and beyond, and to our operating budget which makes it possible to keep our doors open for all who need to hear the Word of God and receive the Sacraments.

Based on this experience, our Stewardship Campaign will focus on Thanksgiving thanksgiving for the ways God has enabled us to walk in love. The highlight of the campaign will be our Ministry Fair scheduled for Sunday October 20, 9:00 am - 1:00 pm in the Parish Hall. Ministry Teams will have the opportunity to share their stories and answer any questions. It will also be an opportunity for us to express our thanks to those who serve in a variety of ministries. As is our tradition, we will have several of our members share their thoughts on this stewardship

theme for several weeks. We will then be invited to reaffirm our commitment to "Walk in Love" in the coming year by filling out estimates of our financial giving in the coming year. The Estimate of Giving (Pledge) cards will be consecrated on Sunday Nov. 17.

I praise God for the privilege of walking with you over the past few years and look forward to "walking in love" with you for many more to come. May God continue to bless you as you continue blessing our church, our community, and our world.

We Got the Car!

We are pleased to announce that following the tremendous response to our plea for donations to help JB acquire a reliable car to enable him to continue shuttling between his three jobs, we finally found the car - a 2014Honda CR-V. Honda is a highly rated car,

and was previously owned by a wonderful Christian man who took very good care of it. We could not be happier and more



grateful to all of you who made it possible.

Before he was forced to flee his native Haiti, JB worked for USAID in Haiti and owned a

computer supplies business. When gang violence erupted, JB was one of the targets and was barely able to make it out alive. He was able to flee to Florida where he was granted a Temporary Protected Status by the US government. He came to our area after learning of a job opportunity with a land-scaping company for which he continues to work as his primary job. He also works at Rural King and drives for Uber. His wife was able to join him 9 months ago but is still awaiting work authorization.




JB started attending our church as soon as he settled in our area and he and his wife are regulars at the 10:30am service. Even though he maintained a positive spirit with a smile, a few of us learned early on about the tremendous stress he was under with his family wife, children, mother, sister, etc. still trapped in the escalating violence back in Haiti. We also learned that the cost of living in Haiti had skyrocketed and with the violence engulfing the island nation, many, including his family members were under the threat of starvation, in addition to the violence. We also learned that he was working as much as he could to support his family back home. With some help, he was able to acquire a dilapidated car which soon proved to be a burden as it was a blessing. Even though it enabled him to get to his several jobs, it cost him thousands in constant repairs. As we were exploring options for a more reliable car, we heard the news that he barely survived an accident when a tree fell on the car while he ate his lunch from the back seat.



When we share the story with our church family, the response went way above our expectation. Many of you gave generously without hesitation. Once again, our church family has proved that we truly know what Jesus meant when he said:

"Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; 35 for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, ³⁶ I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." ³⁷ Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? 38 And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? ³⁹ And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" ⁴⁰ And the king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:34-40).



For all of you who were able to respond to the plea on behalf of JB and his family, and all Thank you! Thank you! Thank you!

Special thanks to all of you who have supported JB ever since he joined us.

May God the source of all goodness keep you steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain. (1 Corinthians 15:58). And as St. Paul rightly put it, "... let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith." Amen.
