

# Rector's Message Celebration of Community by Fr. Samuel Nsengiyumva

The theme for this year's Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday January 26, was *Celebration of Community*. One of the definitions for the word community is "a feeling of fellowship with others, as a result of sharing common attitudes, interests, and goals." While this definition is in no way exhaustive, it captures the essence of what I mean by community. It refers to people who do not only have a common identity and purpose, but know and feel that they truly belong together. It is a great feeling to belong to this

Christian community we know as Holy Trinity Episcopal Church.

As I noted before, this theme was inspired by the many stories I hear of the deep friendships that exist among our members but perhaps more so by the level of commitment to our shared life and mission that I see every day. We have every reason to celebrate.

This spirit of community was very evident in every aspect. It began with our spirit-filled worship in our beautiful sanctuary and followed by a delicious meal prepared and served by own members led by Pat Fleming. THANK YOU to those who helped set up, prepared food, served food and drinks, helped clean up, and gave of their time to




ensure the Annual Meeting was a success! To those who were in attendance, THANK YOU for joining us and being a part of this lovely church family. We hope those
