## Rector's Message

### Give Thanks with a Grateful Heart

I write this reflection a day after the Feast of Christ the King, three days before Thanksgiving Day, and 6 days before the first Sunday of Advent. As you can imagine, the scripture readings for those special days are ringing in my ears and filling me with immense gratitude.

At our Christ the King services, we read that Jesus *“loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood, and made us to be a kingdom, priests serving his God and Father.”* (Revelation 1:5). At the Thanksgiving service, we will be reading that *“The threshing floors shall be full of grain, the vats shall overflow with wine and oil. ...You shall eat in plenty and be satisfied, and praise the name of the Lord your God, who has dealt wondrously with you. And my people shall never again be put to shame.”* (Joel 2:26). On the first Sunday in Advent, we will read that *“In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land.”* (Jeremiah 33:15).

All these readings put together affirm a theme of what God has done and what God will do. They reflect a message of hope in a hurting world. Because of what God has done in Christ, we have hope for the future; and for that we give thanks.

Over the years, I have come to believe that gratitude and hope are choices we make

regardless of circumstances. The General Thanksgiving prayer, on page 836 in our Book of Common Prayer, articulates this point by including thanks for “disappointments and failures that lead us to acknowledge our dependence on you [God] alone.” The prayer concludes with thanksgiving for “Jesus Christ; for the truth of his Word and the example of his life ...; and for his rising to life again, in which we are raised to the life of your [God’s] kingdom.”

On this chilly Florida fall afternoon, I am grateful for all of you, my Holy Trinity Church family. I am grateful for your generosity of time, talent, and treasure as most recently manifested through another successful Stewardship Campaign. I am grateful for your resilience through the challenges of your personal lives and those of our shared life and mission. Above all, I am grateful for the grace of God that enables us to face each new day with faith, hope, and love.

As we begin this Advent season, may your heart be filled with gratitude for all the blessings of your life – your family and friends, work and leisure, food and shelter, and above all for Jesus the Christ who came that you may have life in its fullness (John 10:10). Because of Jesus, whose first coming we commemorate, and whose second coming we await, may you gladly sing:

*Give thanks with a grateful heart, give thanks to the Holy One.*

*Give thanks because He’s given Jesus Christ, His Son.*

*And now let the weak say, “I am strong.” Let the poor say, “I am rich.” Because of what the Lord has done for us; Give thanks.*

Happy Advent!

## Vestry Elections 2025

At our Annual Parish Meeting on Sunday January 26, 2025, we will need to elect three individuals to fill three Vestry positions to be vacated by current members who will have completed their three-year terms and are ineligible for re-election. We are therefore seeking candidates for the above positions that will become vacant in January 2025.

### What is a Vestry?

A Vestry is a body of elected congregational leaders. Congregations that have been granted parish status by their diocese are governed by their rector and the vestry. “Traditionally, and by canon law, the vestry, consisting of wardens and other members, is the legal representative of the parish “in all matters concerning its corporate property and the relations of the Parish to its Clergy,” except as may be provided by state law or diocesan canons (Constitution & Canons of the Episcopal Church, 1.14.2.). The number of vestry members and term of office varies from parish to parish. At Holy Trinity, we have 9 elected members.

### Most vestries have the following officers:

The Presiding Officer is the rector.

There are usually two wardens. The senior warden traditionally chairs the vestry in the absence of the rector and leads the congregation between rectors. In many parishes the senior warden is a support person for the rector. The junior warden often has a particular responsibility for church property and buildings.

A treasurer and secretary or clerk who may or may not be vestry members, may be chosen. The treasurer deposits and disburses funds and oversees financial record keeping. The secretary keeps the minutes, gives notices of

meetings to the parish and maintains vestry records.

Some vestries have an Executive Committee of the rector, wardens, treasurer and committee chairs. They oversee implementation of decisions and plan the agenda.

The responsibility of the vestry, like that of the governing body of any organization, is to:

- Help define and articulate the mission of the congregation;
- Support the mission by word and deed;
- Ensure effective organization and planning;
- Ensure adequate resources in leadership and in financial stewardship;
- Manage resources effectively;
- Determine that appropriate programs, policies, and procedures have been developed and are followed;
- Assess its own performance.

Though the vestry has some similarities to a board of directors, it is important to remember that this ministry of leadership is exercised in the church. The success of a congregation is not measured in terms of numbers of members or size of the endowment, but rather in the degree to which it is working toward the fulfillment of the mission of the church.

### Responsibilities of Individual Members of the Vestry

- Regularly prepare for, attend, and participate in vestry meetings;
- Learn about the mission, goals, programs, services, activities, strengths, and needs of the congregation, diocese, and national church;
- Maintain confidentiality on sensitive topics;
- Serve the congregation as a whole rather than any specific group;

- Encourage complainants to talk directly with the person(s) involved; avoid taking sides; inform rector or senior warden of serious concerns;

#### **A Suitable Candidate for vestry must be:**

- A committed Christian who acknowledges Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior of his or her life.
- A confirmed communicant at least 18 years of age.
- An active voting member of Holy Trinity’s parish for at least two years.
- One who understands the vision and mission of Holy Trinity and is willing to promote it in word and action among other members and the community at large.
- One who supports the life and mission of Holy Trinity by sharing his time, talent and treasure
- One who is involved in one or more ministry teams
- One who is willing to commit to one or more monthly vestry meetings and at least one annual training/retreat event
- One who is willing to provide leadership in every other aspect of our church life and mission.

I am very thankful for the Vestry and their dedication to the stewardship you have

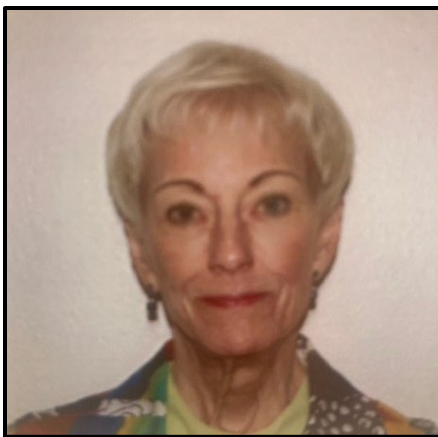
entrusted us with. None of this would run smoothly if not for the wonderful Office Staff we have.

## SCHOOL UPDATES

Our school continues to thrive regardless of challenges related to leadership transitions over the past year.

**Golf Benefit:** The Golf Benefit held in October was a big success. We were able to raise over \$28,000 for the school. Many thanks to Judy & Gregg Monin for spearheading the effort and the many who contributed in a variety of ways to make it a success. **Donations:** We have continued to receive donations for the school including a \$10,000 donation from a parishioner. We are eternally grateful to all who continue to give generously to support the work of the school.

**New Initiatives:** With additional staff, we have been able to introduce new initiatives to help our students succeed. The first month of our **Social Emotional Learning (SEL)** initiative is complete and we believe it has had significant impact. The theme for the month of November was Empathy. The students the meaning of empathy, examples of empathy, and practiced empathy. Future scheduled themes will include Respect, Communication, Conflict Resolution, Perseverance, Resilience & Personal Best, Friendships, Relationships & Peer Pressure, and Good Citizenship. Our Social Emotional Learning counselor is on campus on Mondays three times a month. Our ESE Teacher in collaboration with the School Counselor is busy developing **Individual Learning Plans** and **Individual Behavior Plans**. Our ESE specialist is developing a comprehensive ESE Program and instructions on how it will be implemented. Our Operations coordinator who also serves as our facilities manager is installing a school wide sound system to make

it possible to make announcements to everyone at the same time especially in times of emergency.

**Student Life:** The students elected their peers to the Student Council which immediately went to work by encouraging their fellow students to participate in a food drive to benefit the hungry during this holiday season. Over 400 food and other non-perishable items were collected and delivered to the Salvation Army food pantry. Members of the Student Council were officially commissioned at a Thanksgiving Eucharist held on Thursday November 21.

A field trip is scheduled to the Kennedy Space Center in early December. Preparation for the annual Christmas play and a Christmas Lessons & Carols service are underway. Regardless of ongoing challenges good things are happening at HTES. With your continued support,

**Student Success:** One of our Senior students who is active in our chapel program has been accepted into a Christian college in Jacksonville to pursue a major in Christian Worship. We have recently been hearing stories of our alumni with successful careers in our community and beyond. Our school is truly making a difference.

**New Head of School Search:** The search for a new Head of School has begun. Applicants are being screened for potential interviews. The hope is to have our next Head of School identified by the end of March 2025.

**Parents Group:** Our school parents' group has been busy raising funds to support a variety of causes to benefit the students. The Fundraiser at Fresh Jalapeño Mexican Restaurant raised \$235. The sale of **discount cards** to local businesses continues. ## 138<sup>th</sup> Holy Trinity Anniversary Commemoration

The Vestry met for their monthly meeting on Thursday, November 21, 2024 to discuss matters of importance to the life and mission of our church. The following are the highlights of the meeting:

- The meeting began with an opening prayer from Fr. Samuel followed by the Vestry prayer said in unison.
- Fr. Samuel announced that the Diocesan Convention to be held January 24 and 25, at Trinity Episcopal Church in Vero Beach Florida. 3 lay delegates are needed to represent Holy Trinity.
- The rector reminded the Vestry of the need to fill the 3 openings on the Vestry beginning January 2025.
- The rector reported on the ongoing work of the Campus Exploration Task Force and the School Separate Incorporation

Task Force. Progress is being made by both task-forces.

- The vestry affirmed the proposed Ladies Holiday Event-December 7<sup>th</sup> 2-4 PM
- The Vestry affirmed the idea of a 138<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration worship service
- The Vestry affirmed the schedule for our Christmas services as follows:
  - Christmas Eve Services-December 24<sup>th</sup>- 4:00 PM and 8:00 PM
  - Christmas Day Services-10:30 AM
- The Vestry affirmed Sunday January 26 as the day for our Annual Parish Meeting. There will be one worship service at 9:30 am followed by lunch and business meeting at 11:00 am in the Parish Hall..
- The vestry was updated on the ongoing Stewardship Campaign
- The Vestry reviewed and accepted the treasurer’s report for November.
- The Vestry unanimously approved the proposal to repair of the church’s historic lych-gate
- The Vestry approved a proposal to host an Organ Concert by Dyanne Awe at Holy Trinity in early January. A free-will offering will be received to benefit Holy Trinity School. Details will be communicated as soon as they are concluded.
- The school continues to grow with a new student enrolling in January.
- The Vestry approved the proposal to send the total amount raised for Hurricane Relief to St. Ann’s in Crystal River – a parish in our Deanery that suffered significant damage from Hurricane Helene.
- The Vestry meeting concluded with Compline (late evening prayer).
