

## **Rector's Message Resurrection Hope**

As I look back to the early beginnings of my faith journey, I realize that I tended to focus more on the theological and spiritual meaning of the gospel stories and less on the practical meaning and significance. While I do not regret that approach, I am thankful for the insights I have gained that have allowed me to develop a more comprehensive perspective.

One of the stories of which my perspective has expanded is the story of the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The only meaning I drew from the story as a young believer, was that Jesus died to save us from the consequences of our sins – eternal damnation. While this is undoubtedly the most important lesson from the story, further reflection has led me to a broader meaning and significance.

#### The suffering

Reflecting on the suffering of Jesus during Lent has led me to a deeper understanding and compassion for those who suffer from all kinds of conditions. I think of those who are betrayed by friends or loved ones. I think of the oppressed, the poor, the sick; all those bogged down by forces beyond their control. I realize that, if Jesus, whose very nature was God, needed someone to stand with him at a critical time, surely mere humans are more likely to need someone to stand with them at a time of need. The words of the proper preface for Lent have heavily influenced my perspective: *Through Jesus Christ our Lord; who was tempted in every way as we are, yet did not sin. By his grace we are able to triumph over every evil, and to live no longer for ourselves alone, but for him who died for us and rose again.* 

If there is one lesson to learn from the sufferings of Jesus, it is about the need to be available to those who suffer. The practicalities will vary from situation to situation but we should always find a way to stand with them. I am grateful that many of us here at Holy Trinity have grown to be sensitive to the suffering of others and continue to make ourselves available to those in need in whatever way they need us. In effect, we are agents of resurrection hope.

#### The resurrection

It is interesting to note that the amount of sorrow around us can easily blind us from the hope of things ever getting better. The fact is, all around us, hope is replacing hopelessness, light replacing darkness, good overcoming evil. Resurrection hope is not only about the resurrection of the dead in eschatological terms, it is also about the experience of daily acts of kindness, love, justice, reconciliation, restoration, and healing.

The story of the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus is in many ways a living story -one that we live everyday of our lives. The challenge is how we live out the story. I suggest that we live it with resurrection hope — being present with those who suffer, being and doing the best we can be under the circumstances, and opening ourselves to the possibility of miracles. In the words of Bishop Payne, we need to be people of "miraculous expectation and glorious transformation."

May this Easter season be for you and your loved ones, one that is filled with resurrection hope.

## **Little Red Wagon Salvation Army Food Bank**


